<b>Alberni Clayoquot Regional District</b>	Still At Home – Implementing Action to House our Community and End Homelessness (Healthy Built Environment)	Building on recommendations from Alberni Valley Community Stakeholders Initiative to engage additional partners and leadership to work collaboratively to educate, plan and address housing in the region; and to generate dialogue with regional partners around social determinant and the interconnected nature of our communities, health outcomes, and community planning.
<b>Bowen Island Municipality</b>	Integrated Transportation Master Plan	The Bowen Island Integrated Transportation Master Plan will involve collaboration of the community, government, and other stakeholders and will have an emphasis on active transportation, and local health and well-being priorities.
<b>Capital Regional District - Juan de Fuca Electoral Area</b>	Port Renfrew and Pacheedaht First Nation Healthy Community Initiative	To foster collaboration between the Capital Regional District, the Pacheedaht First Nation, and Island Health to find sustainable solutions to the community health and well-being challenges that fit within the local context.
<b>City of Courtenay</b>	Land Use regulatory options and public education for promoting residential food production in the City of Courtenay	Together with community partners, we will encourage local food production by changing zoning bylaws to allow those who want to garden more productively/profitably the ability to raise small livestock, build greenhouses and sell food from backyard gardens. Will also track core food security indicators for a local Vital Signs Report.
<b>City of Fernie</b>	City of Fernie Affordable Housing Strategy Update ( <i>Planning for a healthy built environment, Positive mental health and well-being</i> )	Fernie residents, businesses, and the social service sector will be engaged in a community consultation process about housing needs in the City, during all phases of the Affordable Housing Strategy update process. Developing community capacity by improving community knowledge of the importance of affordable housing is a key determinant of community health and well-being.

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City of Kelowna	Healthy City Strategy	Development of a Healthy City Strategy focused on healthy built environment, community health, and quality of life for all Kelowna residents.
City of Kimberley	Healthy Kimberley - The Next Level	Build on work with SCOPE and Live 5210 message to build partnership development between sectors and set priorities for health and well-being collaboratively within local planning and policy processes.
City of Nelson	Establishing a Caring, Coordinated Response to the Needs of Nelson's 'Street Culture' Population	The Downtown Nelson 'Street Culture' Collaborative will convene working groups to explore the feasibility of implementing a more integrated and coordinated approach to identify more effective interventions to have a positive impact the mental health and well-being of Nelson's street population.
City of Revelstoke	Together We Can – supporting a new approach to substance use education	The proposed project will engage a variety of community partners to build capacity in our community to strengthen school-family-community connectedness, creating safe spaces for developing a healthy, inspired, proactive dialogue around effective substance use education and positive mental health and well-being for our children and youth.
City of Surrey	Surrey Food Security Collective Impact Group	Building on leadership team's Collective Impact work, the project will focus on changing the environment for residents in the Guildford and Newton neighbourhoods to enhance the availability and accessibility of healthy food, increase income, and develop food literacy.
City of Trail	Greater Trail Healthy Communities Plan	8-10 Greater Trail community agencies that share the objective of creating healthy communities and families, will come together to work through a facilitated process that leads to shared actionable items that enhance physical activity and early childhood development in our region.
City of Williams Lake	Walking and Wheeling in the Puddle - Active Transportation Forum	The Active Transportation committee is planning a walking and wheeling forum in Williams Lake. The purpose of the forum is to bring Active Transportation to the forefront of the citizens of Williams Lake and to identify community champions.
Cowichan Valley Regional District	Cowichan's Regional Airshed Protection Strategy	Implementation of multi-sectoral airshed strategy; development of indicators related to the group's efficiency and relations strengths, linkages, etc; broader understanding of root causes of air pollution in the region to enhance healthy natural environments.
District of Chetwynd	Speakers Series & Community Workshops	Mental Health Forum with a goal is to reduce the silos and build collaboration between peers and residents for the overall mental health of our community.

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<b>District of Lake Country</b>	Lake Country Community Health and Wellness Project	Development of an informed, collaborative, Community Health and Well-being Plan to guide local government, community organizations, businesses and schools in upstream strategies that can be coordinated and implemented across systems.
<b>District of Port Hardy</b>	Unpacking the Urban Agriculture Policies ~ community mobilizing workshops	The District of Port Hardy has a policy to promote Small Scale Urban Agriculture. We propose to “unpack” this forward thinking policy through a series of hands-on skill building workshops to increase ease of use and engagement in local food security, to engage the Community interest, and teach skills that promote sustainability.

<b>District of Tofino</b>	Tofino Indoor Recreation Space Community Consultations	The District of Tofino is leading community consultation to find a solution to the lack of adequate indoor recreation opportunities in our town. Our project will bring together stakeholders and community members to have an open discussion of our needs, and which project option will meet our community’s recreation goals.
<b>Regional District of Nanaimo</b>	Active Transportation Plan - Electoral Area 'H'	This project will engage with the community to develop an Active Transportation Plan. The Plan will include policies, guidelines, and an implementation strategy for creating an environment which supports increased physical activity through community design, policy, and transportation planning.
<b>Strathcona Regional District - Area A</b>	Boat to Table: Developing Access to Seafood in Remote Communities within the Strathcona Regional District	Research the accessibility and consumption of locally landed seafood within the communities of Tahsis, Zeballos, Gold River and Sayward. Identify any barriers and develop means of reducing the barriers.

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<b>Town of Oliver</b>	Oliver Food Security Forum	The food security forum will gather food system stakeholders from Oliver and surrounding area for a one-day event to identify local priorities and provide input on the development of a Food Security plan for Oliver. It will provide an opportunity to hear best practices from speakers that inspire future action.
<b>Town of Smithers</b>	Smithers Community Vitality Report Card	Publish an easy to read, professional quality Smithers Community Vitality Report Card; Host a community event for community members & organizations to review the Report Card and provide feedback.
<b>Village of Chase</b>	"Let's Activate Our Youth" Project	The Chase Youth Action Committee will develop a strategic plan in partnership with other community sectors. This project will help facilitate the next level of youth engagement for healthy community action.
